

LEADS - WHAT IS IT?



LEADERSHIP, EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT SEMINAR is a program designed by GFWC to help future leaders develop the skills and capabilities needed to lead this organization in the future.

It is held annually prior to the GFWC convention. Each state sends one representative to the seminar who is encouraged to share the information she receives with clubs and districts.

Each club in CFWC is encouraged to nominate one woman as a candidate to attend LEADS. The names of the candidates are submitted to the district LEADS chair who, with a committee, will select a candidate to be submitted to the CFWC chairman.

Each district candidate will attend a LEADS event at the February CFWC state board meeting. On person selected from that seminar will represent CFWC at the GFWC convention.

Candidate information forms are available in the CFWC Procedure Manual-Yearbook Completed forms MUST be submitted to Joyce Opjorden by December 10, 2023.



Instructions for Completion of the ...

San Buenaventura Women's Club Volunteer Hours and Donation Sheet

(Do not return this information sheet with your completed hour sheet.)

These are the things you should include in each section to be used for our yearly report to the state. The report is completed monthly for hours reported in January-December.

Advocates for Children

• List any hours spent: reading to children, tutoring children with homework, donating to programs and services that support children, such as; Step Up Ventura, City Center, Boys and Girls Club, etc.

Arts & Culture

- List any hours spent: attending cultural enriching events, such as; plays, museums, musicals, etc.
- List hours spent making craft items, specify if craft items were donated for fundraising, art shows, donated directly to the community, etc.

Civic Engagement & Outreach

• List any hours writing cards to Veterans, creating and sending care packages to military, flying your flag, census gathering, Voter Registration work, crime prevention (such as neighborhood watch), and any other activities related to self and community safety and crime prevention.

Communication & Public Relations

• List any hours spent: writing newsletters and information notices to the club members, time spent on women's club related social media, reading GFWC and CFWC materials, wearing club t-shirts for advertising the club, handing out business cards and brochures for the club outreach for new members, and any other activities that share the women's club opportunity with the community.

Domestic & Sexual Violence Awareness & Prevention

• List any hours spent: supporting domestic violence programs, donation to thrift stores that support domestic violence programs, volunteer hours for programs that support women and children experiencing domestic violence and/or sexual abuse, support for organizations, such as; Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA), Interface, Child Abuse and Neglect (CAAN) Thrift Stores and other such organizations, etc.

Education & Libraries

 List any hours spent: reading (list these hours in ESO section if you are a registered ESO member), book club mmetings, adult classes, volunteering at schools, attending any self-enrichment trainings, workshops, online video tutorials, and programs.

Environment

• List any hours spent and funds donated: to Pennies for Pines, feeding birds, nature clean up projects, gardening, bee conservation, picking up trash, or any other programs available that support environmental improvement opportunities, etc.

Fundraising & Development

- List any hours spent: on fundraising projects, making baskets, gathering donations, decorating, etc.
- Number of Bras donated to "Support the Girls" Project
- Number of Shoes donated to "Soles for Souls" Program

Health & Wellness

• List any hours spent: at self-care doctor & dentist appointments, visiting persons in the hospital or senior care centers, driving persons to their appointments, donating blood, guide dog program donations, red cross donation of time or funds, and time and funds spent on any program supporting health and wellness in the club and in the community, etc.

Leadership

• List any hours spent: in active leadership programs, board meeting, preparing agendas & minutes, attending and/or viewing leadership workshops/mentoring programs, including online mentoring programs from GFWC/CFWC and/or any other organization that teaches leadership skills, etc.

Legislation/Public Policy

• List any hours spent: advocating for public policies to support social causes, writing and/or lobbying Elected Officials, writing proposals for resolutions and policies.

Membership

 List any hours spent: building membership activities, Memorial Ceremonies, Orientation for new members, volunteer recognition projects, include anything you do to help increase memberships, inviting friends to come to the general luncheon meeting, etc.

Women's Health & Resource Center

• Any hours spent researching and sharing women's history, volunteer services or donations to organizations supporting women's history, club and district celebration honoring clubwomen.

Epsilon Sigma Omicron (ESO)

• If you are registered as an ESO member, list hours spent reading and the name of books read.

Guidelines for what is entered into each column for volunteer hours, dollars donated/raised, in-kind donations, dollars spent:

- ⇒ Volunteer Hours is the amount of time that members worked on approved programs and projects.
- ⇒ Dollars Donated/Raised is the monetary amount given to programs and projects.
- ⇒ In-Kind Donations reflect the monetary value for goods provided to programs and projects. Please refer to the CFWC In-Kind Donation Guide for an estimate value of commonly donated items. (GFWC.org)
- ⇒ Dollars Spent are costs incurred by members, clubs or districts to achieve advancement plan goals.
- ⇒ Dollars Raised reflects the dollars earned from fundraising and development programs and projects.
